Laos offers an intimate middle chapter: a Baci welcome, a rice farm, waterfalls and a boat journey on the Mekong. Cambodia brings the grandeur of Angkor and a thoughtful conclusion in its riverside capital. This private grand journey is designed to feel connected rather than crowded. The days are rich in sites, activities and local encounters, with flights used where they protect your time and a buffer night after the bay. Your guide in each country brings local understanding; the Midasia team coordinates the whole. Room styles, dining, walking and special interests are tailored to the people travelling.

Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam

DAY 01

Your private welcome to Ho Chi Minh City

Arrive at Tan Son Nhat International Airport, where your Midasia Routes representative meets you in the arrivals area after immigration and baggage collection. A private vehicle, chilled drinking water and assistance with your luggage make the transition to your hotel easy. Airport fast-track assistance can be requested where the airport permits it.

After settling in, meet your local guide for a personal introduction to Ho Chi Minh City. Depending on your landing time and energy, enjoy a short neighbourhood walk, a riverside pause or a first taste of the city in a relaxed café. Your guide confirms food preferences, walking comfort and the experiences that matter most to you.

A thoughtfully chosen welcome dinner introduces regional flavours. The evening remains gentle after your international journey; a late arrival means dinner and orientation are adjusted to your flight. Your first night is a comfortable beginning, with the details of tomorrow already taken care of.

DAY 02

Cu Chi and the stories of Saigon

Leave early for the Cu Chi tunnel area, where a specialist guide explains the ingenuity and hardship of wartime life. The surface displays provide a meaningful visit without requiring anyone to enter a tunnel. Tunnel sections are optional and unsuitable for some travelers with limited mobility or claustrophobia.

After lunch, return to the city for the Independence Palace, exploring the formal rooms and the events associated with the building. Add the Central Post Office if it was not visited earlier. A short café stop gives time to discuss what you have seen without moving straight into another intense museum.

Dinner offers a lighter conclusion to the day. Adults particularly interested in modern history can request the War Remnants Museum in place of a city stop; its graphic material is discussed in advance, and families are offered an age-appropriate alternative.

Mekong Delta, Vietnam

DAY 03

The Mekong Delta: coconut gardens and family kitchens

Travel from the city to Ben Tre after breakfast and board a private local boat. Follow broad river channels and smaller waterways, observing the changing uses of the banks. Stop at a family-run coconut workshop or other working craft business, where hosts explain their trade.

Enjoy lunch in a garden setting and explore quiet village lanes on foot, by a short optional bicycle ride or with a local vehicle. A small rowing boat can take you through a palm-fringed creek when water conditions allow. Your guide keeps the focus on everyday livelihoods and genuine conversations.

Return to Ho Chi Minh City for dinner. This is a substantial day excursion, so the evening stays close to your hotel. The private arrangement allows you to spend longer with a welcoming host and shorten a stop that feels less interesting to your family or friends.

DAY 04

A flight to Da Nang, an evening in Hoi An

Transfer from your hotel in Ho Chi Minh City to the airport for a scheduled flight to Da Nang. Your Midasia team meets you on arrival and continues privately to Hoi An. Flight times are selected to protect a worthwhile afternoon wherever practical, with lunch fitted around the journey.

After checking in, walk through Hoi An's historic trading quarter with your guide. Visit a merchant house and an assembly hall, then explore the Japanese Covered Bridge area and riverside streets. Exact interiors depend on opening hours; the town's story is brought alive through people, architecture and trade.

Enjoy a lantern-making session when the flight schedule allows, or move it to the next Hoi An day. Dinner introduces regional specialities such as cao lau and white-rose dumplings. A relaxed riverfront walk rounds off the evening without a late return to the hotel.

Hoi An, Vietnam

DAY 05

From the herb garden to your own Vietnamese table

Visit Tra Que with a local host, walking between aromatic herb beds and learning how the gardens supply Hoi An's kitchens. Join light seasonal tasks such as watering, preparing a bed or harvesting herbs; the experience is adapted for children and for travelers who prefer to observe.

Use the morning's ingredients in a private cooking session followed by lunch. In the afternoon, explore Hoi An's old town more deeply, with time for a merchant house, an assembly hall and artisan workshops that match your interests. Your guide introduces the trading history behind the familiar yellow facades.

As dusk approaches, make a lantern with a craft teacher or enjoy a short private river outing where local rules allow. Dinner is arranged after time to refresh. The day combines gardening, food, heritage and creativity, with a vehicle available whenever you want to shorten the walking.

DAY 06

My Son, riverside craft and the art of making

Leave early for My Son, allowing time to explore the Cham sanctuary before the heat builds. Walk the main paths between the surviving brick towers with your private guide and learn how religious practice, architecture and modern conservation meet in this forested valley.

Return towards Hoi An for lunch, then visit Thanh Ha pottery village for a hands-on session with a willing artisan. If you would like more time on the water, include a gentle basket-boat outing in the Cam Thanh coconut-waterway area, choosing a calm experience rather than noisy spinning demonstrations.

After a pause at your hotel, enjoy dinner and a final lantern-lit walk. This is a full day with several different settings, so the pottery or boat section can be shortened for families. The cultural encounters are prearranged, while temple and village areas remain shared public places.

DAY 07

From the central coast to the capital

Enjoy breakfast and a short local stop around Hoi An if your flight permits. Transfer privately to Da Nang airport for a scheduled flight to Hanoi, with the local team handling the onward vehicle and hotel arrangements. The airline schedule determines the precise order of the day.

After settling in, take a gentle guided walk around Hoan Kiem Lake and nearby streets. A café stop offers an introduction to northern flavours and the city's street life. Detailed museum and monument visits are reserved for the following day, avoiding pressure after a flight delay.

Dinner features a selection of Hanoi specialities in a setting chosen for your comfort. Your guide reviews the bay-cruise arrangements and any food preferences that the boat crew should know. This evening brings a different mood after the coastal light and trading-town atmosphere of Hoi An.

DAY 08

Hanoi: a city revealed in layers

Begin beside Hoan Kiem Lake as the city wakes, then explore the Old Quarter with a guide who can explain the street trades, communal houses and everyday etiquette. Pause for Vietnamese coffee before entering the Temple of Literature, where courtyards, stone stelae and shaded gardens introduce the country's scholarly traditions.

After lunch, visit the Thang Long Imperial Citadel and follow the story of Vietnam's successive capitals. Continue through the French Quarter, stopping for architectural details and street scenes rather than a hurried checklist. Museum and monument visits are reordered around their weekly closures.

An early evening water-puppet performance brings rural legends to life. Finish with a guided tasting of carefully selected Hanoi dishes, with seated alternatives for travelers who prefer a restaurant to street-side dining. Your private vehicle is available between the walking sections.

Ha Long Bay region, Vietnam

DAY 09

Your private voyage into Bai Tu Long Bay

Depart Hanoi after breakfast for the coast, travelling by private vehicle with a comfort stop before boarding. Meet the crew of your exclusively chartered small boat and settle into your cabin. A safety briefing covers the tender, kayaking and the day's permitted anchorage before lunch is served.

Cruise into Bai Tu Long's limestone seascape. The planned charter follows an authorised three-day route, with an afternoon excursion around the Cong Do area or an equivalent approved location. Depending on conditions, take a guided kayak outing or use a tender to enjoy the scenery without paddling.

Return for a Vietnamese cooking demonstration and sunset on deck, then enjoy dinner prepared aboard. Your boat is private to your party, while the protected bay and visitor sites remain public. The captain may change the precise stop sequence for weather, permissions and harbour instructions.

DAY 10

A full day among islands, caves and floating homes

Enjoy breakfast with the limestone islands close to your boat, then set out with the crew for a cave visit such as Thien Canh Son when included in the authorised sailing plan. Your guide explains the rock formations and the changing relationship between fishing communities, tourism and the protected bay.

Lunch is followed by a guided visit around Vung Vieng or the charter's approved floating-village area. A tender or local rowing boat brings you closer to the water. There is also time for a sheltered kayak excursion; less active travelers can remain aboard or join the scenic tender alternative.

As the boat reaches its overnight anchorage, enjoy the changing light from the deck. Dinner is served at a pace that suits your party. Two nights aboard allow a richer exploration than a single-night visit, without turning every hour into an organised activity. Swimming, if offered, depends on authorised locations and conditions.

DAY 11

Back to Hanoi, with time to look closer

Wake to the bay and enjoy breakfast as your boat returns towards its authorised harbour. A final short excursion may be offered by the captain before brunch and disembarkation. Your driver meets you for the private transfer to Hanoi; lunch timing is coordinated with the cruise service.

Check into your hotel and refresh before a gentle late-afternoon encounter with contemporary Vietnamese craft. Depending on opening hours, meet a lacquer specialist or a small independent gallery team, learning how traditional materials are used in modern work. This is also valuable breathing space between the water and tomorrow's flight.

Dinner is arranged in Hanoi, with time to discuss the next stage with your guide. The city overnight intentionally protects the onward connection: no international flight is booked immediately after a weather-dependent bay cruise.

DAY 12

Hanoi to Luang Prabang: a graceful change of pace

Enjoy breakfast and a final Hanoi experience fitted around your flight: a small craft studio, a quiet café or an unhurried neighbourhood walk. Transfer privately to the airport for the published Hanoi–Luang Prabang route. Your start date is chosen around a suitable service, with any alternative connection agreed before booking.

Arrive in Laos and meet your local team after immigration and baggage collection. Continue privately to a heritage-style hotel or a more secluded riverside retreat selected for your preferences. The afternoon programme stays flexible because the most practical direct flight may arrive later in the day.

Enjoy your first Lao dinner when arrival time allows. Your guide introduces local customs and the coming days of temples, farming and river life. If you arrive early, a gentle peninsula walk is a pleasant first encounter; the substantive heritage visits are reserved for tomorrow.

DAY 13

Luang Prabang: living traditions and a Baci welcome

Begin with the morning market and the town's everyday food traditions, then visit the former Royal Palace museum and Wat Xieng Thong. Your guide explains the architecture, royal history and living Buddhist traditions. Any observation of morning alms is quiet and respectful, without interrupting participants or using flash.

After lunch, meet a textile or craft specialist for an introduction to the distinct communities of northern Laos. Visit the Traditional Arts and Ethnology Centre when open, or use a prearranged artisan session as the alternative. Allow time to browse contemporary work and ask questions.

Join a Baci ceremony arranged with willing local hosts and an experienced ceremony leader. White threads, spoken blessings and shared goodwill create a personal welcome; participation follows the hosts' customs. Enjoy dinner afterwards. A Phousi viewpoint visit can be added if the steps and timing suit you.

Overnight: Luang Prabang | Meals: Breakfast, lunch & dinner

DAY 14

Rice farming, turquoise falls and rescued bears

Visit the Living Land community farm for a prebooked rice experience. Learn how seedlings, irrigation, harvesting and processing connect to the Lao table, joining light tasks suited to the season and your comfort. Participants can try the muddy stages or observe from the field edge; children receive age-appropriate involvement.

After lunch, continue to Kuang Si. Walk the lower forest paths and visit the public viewing area of the Tat Kuang Si Bear Rescue Centre, where rescued bears illustrate a conservation story. Follow the path to the waterfalls and enjoy the turquoise pools, with swimming only in permitted areas when conditions allow.

Return to Luang Prabang for dinner and an optional short browse of the evening craft market. This is a full day, so the walk remains moderate and the upper, steeper waterfall trail is optional. Bear viewing follows sanctuary rules and is distinct from a specially booked care tour.

Overnight: Luang Prabang | Meals: Breakfast, lunch & dinner



DAY 15

A private Mekong boat, sacred caves and artisan hands

Board your private riverboat after breakfast and cruise upstream along the Mekong. Watch the changes along the banks while your guide explains the river's role in transport, farming and trade. Visit Pak Ou's lower Buddha cave; the additional steps to the upper cave are optional.

Enjoy lunch aboard or at a suitable riverside venue, then continue with a prearranged craft stop. A village or workshop visit may focus on weaving, paper-making or another locally practised skill. Your guide checks that hosts are available and that the stop adds a worthwhile encounter rather than a shopping obligation.

Return to town in the late afternoon. After time to refresh, enjoy dinner with Lao specialities matched to your dietary preferences. The journey takes place on the navigable Mekong stretch around Luang Prabang, with exact landing points selected for water levels and the day's operating permissions.

Overnight: Luang Prabang | Meals: Breakfast, lunch & dinner

DAY 16

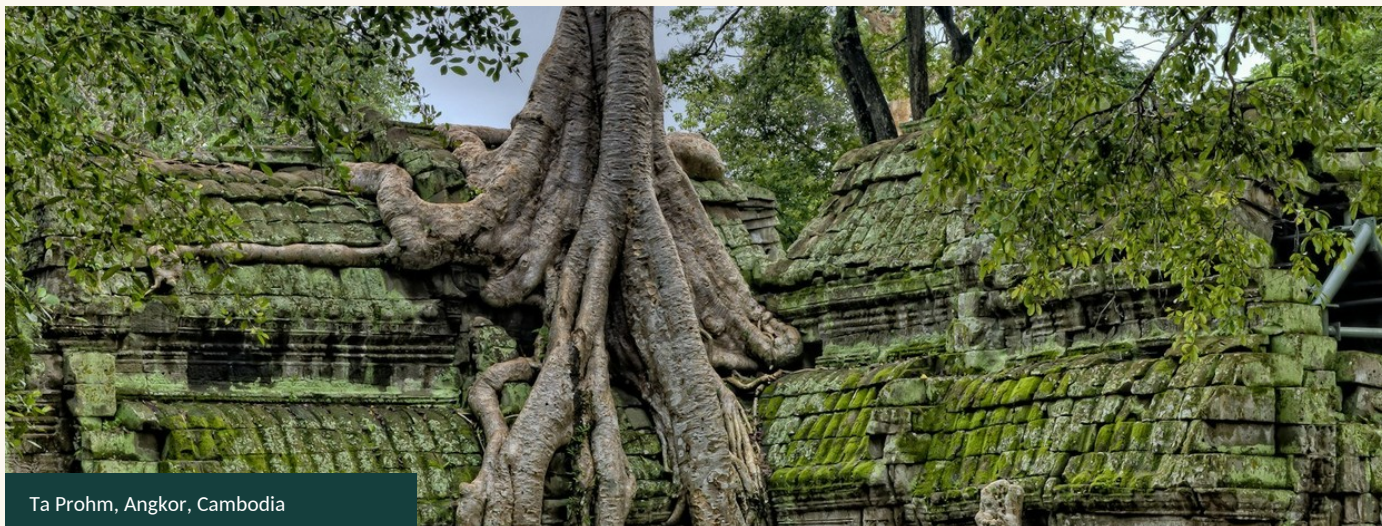
A new kingdom: welcome to Cambodia

After breakfast, transfer privately to the airport in Luang Prabang. Use the published Luang Prabang-Siem Reap route on an operating day; a suitable connection is agreed if a direct service does not fit. Flight days are planned around published operation, and the final proposal confirms the actual service and baggage arrangements before payment. The journey does not rely on an unverified daily direct flight.

Meet your Cambodian guide at Siem Reap Angkor airport after immigration and baggage collection. Continue privately to your hotel, with lunch or refreshments coordinated around arrival. A gentle orientation introduces the city and gives time to discuss the Angkor visits, walking comfort and food preferences.

Enjoy dinner and, when arrival time permits, a relaxed browse of local design shops or a café stop. Temple visits begin the following morning. The emphasis today is a smooth country-to-country handover, leaving you ready to enjoy Cambodia rather than arriving straight into a demanding sightseeing circuit.

DAY 17

Angkor: a day worthy of the journey

Leave before dawn if you would like to see Angkor Wat as the light changes, then explore the galleries and courtyards with your private guide. The visit goes beyond a photograph: read the bas-reliefs, understand the temple's symbolism and follow its changing religious life. A later start is possible for families.

After breakfast or a substantial refreshment stop, continue to the great faces of Bayon and selected terraces of Angkor Thom. Lunch and a proper hotel break divide the day. Your guide works around permitted access, heat and conservation restrictions rather than promising empty monuments or closed areas.

Visit Ta Prohm in the later afternoon, when roots and stone create a different atmosphere, then return for dinner. This is a full temple day with uneven paths and steps, but the private vehicle and guide allow shorter walking circuits without losing the essential story.

Overnight: Siem Reap | Meals: Breakfast, lunch & dinner

DAY 18

Fine stone, living craft and a Cambodian evening

Travel to Banteay Srei in the cooler morning, taking time to appreciate its intricate carvings and intimate scale. Your guide helps identify the stories in the stone. A countryside stop introduces local produce or palm-based livelihoods when a host is available and the activity is genuinely taking place.

After lunch, return towards Siem Reap for a prebooked APOPO visitor experience, where the team explains its mine-detection work and the role of trained rats. Continue to a reputable artisan studio for a hands-on or hosted craft encounter. Animal demonstrations follow the centre's welfare procedures and available programme.

Enjoy dinner, then attend a Phare performance when the scheduled show fits your date. Its contemporary storytelling adds another dimension to Cambodia after the ancient temples. If no suitable performance runs, replace it with a longer private dinner or a different locally produced cultural evening.

National Museum, Phnom Penh, Cambodia

DAY 19

Across Cambodia to its riverside capital

Leave Siem Reap after breakfast in your private vehicle. Break the cross-country journey at the historic Kampong Kdei bridge when access permits, where your guide explains the engineering and trade routes of the Khmer world. Refreshment stops are planned before lunch.

Continue to Phnom Penh, arriving with time to check in and recover from the road. Depending on traffic and daylight, take a gentle riverside orientation or visit Wat Phnom. This is a genuine transfer day; major museum visits are kept for tomorrow rather than added to an already full journey.

Dinner is arranged in a refined but relaxed city restaurant. Your guide introduces the capital's royal, colonial and contemporary layers, and confirms your preferences for tomorrow's history programme. The private vehicle allows comfortable stops without relying on a rushed intercity schedule.

Overnight: Phnom Penh | Meals: Breakfast, lunch & dinner

DAY 20

Phnom Penh: royal heritage and a private river sunset

Explore the Royal Palace and Silver Pagoda when official functions allow access, then visit the National Museum's Khmer art collection. Your private guide helps connect the objects with the temples already seen. Walk between selected central stops or use the car according to the weather and your comfort.

After lunch, choose a deeper city experience: contemporary Cambodian art and a market visit, or Tuol Sleng for adults who want to understand the Khmer Rouge period. The latter is emotionally demanding and is discussed in advance; families receive an appropriate alternative.

Board a private boat for a sunset outing on the rivers around the city when conditions permit, then enjoy a farewell dinner. The day brings together artistic achievement, difficult history and the energy of modern Cambodia, with space to reflect rather than hurry through the final chapter.

Phnom Penh, Cambodia

DAY 21

A thoughtful farewell

Enjoy breakfast and a final quiet moment in Phnom Penh. If your flight allows, your guide can arrange a short market visit or a stop for last-minute locally made gifts; this is fitted around check-out and airport formalities, never around an optimistic connection.

Your private driver transfers you to Techo International Airport. The team assists with luggage and check-in orientation within the areas open to local representatives. Your international flight, onward baggage arrangements and any airport assistance are reconfirmed before departure.

Leave with the memories of people met, food shared and landscapes explored. A beach extension, a different onward destination or extra nights can be arranged when we customise the journey. International flights are quoted separately unless your personal proposal expressly includes them.

Overnight: Departure | Meals: Breakfast, flight time permitting

Your confirmed proposal · Route planning was reviewed in September 2026. Your final dated proposal confirms the hotels, flights, boats, rail seats, host visits, activity suitability and any seasonal substitutions before you commit.
